Learn the unforced rhythms of grace.



Face of Britain has changed Religion is back in the public square but it's a confusing place



Have (a) faith

On the one hand, it's not all bad...

physical landscape looks very different to 30 years ago

faith partners at the local authority/area agreement table

religion and belief now part of legislation; Equality and Human Rights Commission

religion is recognised as a difference

spirituality is cool and has even become a consumer item

On the other hand – while faith groups might be ok

Faith of faith groups is 'dodgy' – especially Christianity - and faith schools are not ok

The battle for secularism is being fought more vigorously – winterval, separation of church and state etc

Politicians and the media still 'don't do' God (very much)

Faith is seen as fundamentalist and divisive

We have not settled the 'crosses and head dresses' debate



So what's going on??



Ignorance

People have literally lost the plot; the thread of the big story has been forgotten



Fear

People are frightened of religion

Most of the 'world' wars are caused by religion

Faith has become the new taboo



Confusion

People might know about religions but the faith debate is more difficult



Religion is this... to keep oneself from being polluted by the world (James)


What happens if you get the usage wrong?

The prince of this world is coming....


I urge you as strangers and aliens in this world































Growing

Some core Christian beliefs

Each individual is made in God's image God is love God became one of us Death is not the end



First, what do these beliefs mean?

Each individual is made in God's image - God created all of us, making us all equal and all different

God is love - his love is unconditional and therefore we don't have to earn it

God became one of us – he sent Christ to help us relate to him and to others.

Death is not the end - God overcame death;

How do they affect our behaviour

Because each individual is made in God's image we should treat people in the same way, with dignity, respecting their differences

God is love and therefore we are loved and accepted for who we are and we can be accepting

God became one of us. He is not distant or remote. He came to serve us as a role model for us to follow.

Death is not the end. Therefore it is possible to have hope. Our task is to be agents of hope and transformation in our work and relationships

Beliefs and Behaviours

God created us all - we can relate to everyone equally

God is love – we are accepted and we can be inclusive of others

God became one of us - in the same way we can be committed to relationships

Death is not the end – we can have hope: even the darkest situation can be transformed






